APPLICATION FOR ACCRUED PENSION.

D.*, 1883, personally appeared *Willday Hardin*, who, being duly sworn, declares that she is the lawful widow of *Hiram Hardin*, deceased; that he died on the *18th* day of *October*, 1882; that he had been granted a pension by Certificate No. *25388* which is ~~herewith returned~~ (or if not, state why not) *Already on file in the Pension office*; that he had been paid the pension by the Pension Agent at *New Orleans, La.* up to the *20th* day of *March A. D.*, 1882; after which date he had not been employed or paid in the Army, Navy, or Marine service of the United States, except *the payment above referred to*; that she was married to the said *Hiram Hardin* on the *1st* day of *February*, 1882, at *Monroe County*, in the State of *Alabama*; that her name before said marriage was *Willday Hicks*; that she hereby makes application for the pension which had accrued on aforesaid certificate to the date of death; and that her residence is No. _____ Street, City of _____, County of *Calcasieu*, State of *Louisiana*, and her Post-office address is *Lake Charles Louisiana*.

Black*, residing at *Lake Charles Louisiana*, who, being duly sworn, say that they were present and saw *Willday Hardin* sign her name (make her mark) to the foregoing declaration; that they know her to be the lawful widow of *Hiram Hardin*, who died on the *18th* day of *October A. D.*, 1882; and that their means of knowledge that said parties were husband and wife, and that the husband died on said date, are as follows:

That for Twelve or Thirteen years they have been well & personally acquainted with the parties and that they ever always know & recognized as lawful husband & wife
